

Mingle and include everyone within ten feet of them in conversation before worship. Be sure to make introductions, offer seats, and create connections. •Rule of 3— Practice the rule of three. Spend the first three minutes after the worship service to greet guests get to know them and express getting to know them better. • Neighborhood Groups Coming—Every church member and regular visitor will be placed into a neighborhood group. Community is important this is why: In smaller communities we connect and grow as individuals, families and Christians; We make deeper friendships; We can care for each other better; We can check in on people we haven't seen.

#### Endowment Fund Annual Report 2016-2017

The Endowment Fund was established in 1995 to offer the opportunity to individuals to make Legacy gifts to the church. It was originally funded with about \$40,000 thanks to two substantial bequests from long time members. These gifts are invested in order to provide lasting long-term growth and income to the church. The income is then available to advance the mission of our church with an emphasis on non-recurring programs and purpose rather than regularly budgeted expenses. The fund has grown since 1995 to a level that now allows for annual disbursements for various projects. The fund has grown from \$128,962 on October 31, 2016 to \$148,054 on October 31, 2017. This comes primarily from investment growth, interest income and individual donations. Recent disbursements included \$5,257 for a telephone system upgrade and \$1,000 for an electronic drum set for the Youth Underground Ministry. Disbursements to date total \$35,738 for various projects including audio & video projects, office renovations, The 175<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration and a computer system upgrade. A special thanks to those who have contributed to the fund and to those who have helped find projects that help to fulfil our congregation's vision for the present and the future. Donations offer the satisfaction of knowing your gifts continue working for years to come, thus the term Legacy Giving. 
