**Oasis Room Update**—This past summer we renovated the cry room and adopted a new name, The Oasis Room, for this space adjacent to the sanctuary. By design, this room is available on an as needed basis for nursing moms, individuals with mobility issues after injury or surgery, individuals with special needs, individuals recovering from illness or grief, and children having difficulty in the worship\* service. In an effort to truly make this an extension of our worship space, we will be posting the following guidelines for use of The Oasis Room during worship services.

- Casual conversations and use of electronic devices by adults should be limited.
- Refrain from eating in this space, just as you would the sanctuary (a small snack for a young child is fine). Christler Hall is a space that is typically available for eating should the need arise.
- Due to space constraints, we ask that you limit the number of family members in the room so that it is available to as many individuals/families as possible.

PLEASE NOTE THAT OUR SERVICES ARE AVAILABLE BY LIVE STREAM IN OUR NURSERY. PARENTS ARE WELCOME TO JOIN THEIR CHILDREN 3 AND UNDER IN THE NURSERY IF NEEDED.
